Discussion

The Wairarapa Branch and National Office of the NZ Forest and Bird Society (431.6) support the Policies and Methods of Chapter 12 of the Plan but request that more emphasis be placed on protecting freshwater biodiversity, including guidelines and regulations relating to the prevention of siltation due to erosion, diffuse pollution, habitat loss and the like. Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc) (FS85) and D Riddiford (FS112) opposed this submission.

Evidence Heard

Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc) (FS85) spoke in support of their submission opposing the amendments sought by Wairarapa Branch and National Office of the NZ Forest and Bird Society.

Commissioners' Deliberations

The Commissioners noted the general support from the submitters for the Freshwater Zone. In respect of the request for more emphasis on protecting freshwater biodiversity, the Commissioners note the holistic nature of the document and Section 11.3.7 of the Plan which lists Methods to implement indigenous biodiversity policies. Therefore, the Commissioners adopt the Section 42A Report recommendation which retains the existing approach.

Discussion

The **Department of Conservation** (525.41) seeks that paragraph 7 of 12.1 be amended to recognise that activities on the surface of waterbodies have potential to impact on natural values. **Wairarapa Public Health** (498.5) seeks that the Introduction be amended to include a statement regarding the protection of water supply catchments. **Wellington Fish and Game Council** (496.2) advises that the maintenance and enhancement of public access to waterways is required under section 6(b) of the Act. The submission seeks that paragraph 6 of 12.1 be amended to recognise that, while it is relevant to consider the impact on adjoining landowners when creating new public access to waterways, it is not appropriate where public legal access is already established. **Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc)** and **D Riddiford** oppose this submission.

Evidence Heard

The **Department of Conservation** (525.41) spoke in support of their submission and expressed support for the amended provision recommended in the Section 42A Report relating to increased scale and intensity of activities. **Wairarapa Public Health** (498.5) did not appear as they advised all their issues had been addressed in the Section 42A Report. **Wellington Fish and Game Council** (496.2) spoke in support of their submission regarding public access. **Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc)** (FS85) spoke in support of their submission and support for the Section 42A Report recommending those submissions that call for more restrictive measures be rejected.

Commissioners' Deliberations

The Section 42A Report made recommendations on amendments to Section 12.1 Introduction. The Commissioners note the support from submitters in relation to the amendments. In respect of the submission seeking amendments to Paragraph 6 of 12.1, the Commissioners support the comments made in the Section 42A Report relating to access. The Commissioners support the adoption of the Section 42A Report recommendation and proposed amendments.

Decision Amendment: 12.1 Introduction

Amend paragraph 7 of '12.1 Introduction' as follows:

"The surface of waterbodies in the Wairarapa is used for a range of activities, mainly recreational, and some food gathering. In themselves, these activities rarely have any adverse effects on the waterbodies; The potential for conflict is often between such activities: for example, between jet boating and fishing. Although such activities may not currently have significant effects on natural values, increased activity such as jet boat use can also adversely effect wildlife. However, such issues are, as yet, not significant, as the level of such activities currently is relatively low."

Amend paragraph 8 of '12.1 Introduction' as follows:

"Activities on land near water bodies can adversely affect the water if not properly managed. Such activities and their potential effects include pollution from sewage disposal systems and septic tanks, nutrient escape from primary production, discharges from industry and increased runoff and siltation from land cleared of vegetation. Such effects are particularly important when managing water supply catchment areas. While many of these matters are managed by the Regional Council, the effects of subdivision and development...."

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Reasons

This decision is made for the following reasons:

The purpose of the Freshwater provisions is to promote the sustainable management of the freshwater environment. A balance is required between protecting freshwater biodiversity and enabling activities. The amended paragraphs better describes the activities associated with freshwater environments and their potential adverse effects.

Discussion

Wellington Fish and Game Council (496.3) seeks that Significant Resource Management Issue 2 be amended to recognise that, while it is relevant to consider the impact on adjoining land owners when creating new public access to waterways, it is not appropriate where public legal access is already established. **Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc)** and **D Riddiford** oppose this submission.

Evidence Heard

Wellington Fish and Game Council (496.2) spoke in support of their submission regarding public access. **Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc)** (FS85) spoke in support of their submission and endorsed the Section 42A Report recommendation that those submissions that call for more restrictive measures be rejected.

Commissioners' Deliberations

In respect of the submission seeking amendments to Significant Resource Management Issue 2, the Commissioners support the comments made in the Section 42A Report relating to access. It is not considered that activities occurring on existing legally established accessways along waterbodies are excluded of the duty under the Act to avoid, remedy or mitigate any adverse effects of activities. The Commissioners support the adoption of the Section 42A Report recommendation of retaining the existing issue Statement unchanged.

This decision is made for the following reasons:

- The Resource Management Act requires that the adverse effects of activities be avoided, remedied or mitigated. Such a duty applies for existing and prosped accessways. As such it is considered appropriate the issue be retained.
- The issue of peoples safety and wellbeing from activities on the accessway and the
 effects on and from the adjoining land is relevant where the public accessway is
 already legally established or whether it is a proposed accessway.

Discussion

Wellington Regional Council (526.34) seek that Objective Fwe1 be amended by adding 'ground-water' as one of the waterbodies to be maintained or enhanced, and for the detrimental effects of development and activities to be managed. **Horticulture NZ** oppose this submission.

Evidence Heard

Wellington Regional Council (526.34) presented evidence stating they accepted the Section 42A Report recommendation amending Objective Fwe1. It was noted that the recommended amendment did not include the words 'by managing" as requested by the submitter.

Commissioners' Deliberations

The effect of development and activities on the environmental quality of groundwater is recognised in the amendment to Objective Fwe1, as requested by Greater Wellington Regional Council. The Commissioners support the adoption of the Section 42A Report recommendation and believe the recommendation better reflects the effects of development and activities on waterbodies. Upon consideration of the further evidence provided at the hearing in relation to the insertion of the words "by managing", the Commissioners believe the inclusion of these words adds clarity to the intent of the Objective and therefore the Commissioners believe the insertion of the words "by managing" is appropriate.

Wairarapa Inc/Go Wairarapa (398.20) consider that Policy (b) implies an ability to measure the positive and negative effects of land use on freshwater, questions who will provide the measurements, and suggests that there is an overlap with the Regional Freshwater Plan.

Evidence Heard

No specific evidence was presented on this point.

Commissioners' Deliberations

The Commissioners support the comments made in the Section 42A Report relating to policy (b). It was noted that the focus of the District Plan is on managing the adverse effects of land use and subdivision on the District's natural and physical resources, including water resources, and that the role of the District Council is to achieve the integrated management of the effects of land use on natural and physical resources of the district. The Commissioners support the adoption of the Section 42A Report recommendation.

Discussion

Wellington Fish and Game Council (496.5) seek Policy (c) be retained.

Wairarapa Inc/Go Wairarapa (398.20) consider that Policy (c) implies an ability to measure the positive and negative effects of land use on freshwater, questions who will provide the measurements, and suggests that there is an overlap with the Regional Freshwater Plan.

Genesis Power Ltd (441.5) seek Policy (c) be amended to focus on avoiding, remedying or mitigating adverse effects as opposed to "discouraging subdivision, land use and development" that the submitter considers the Policy currently focuses on. Genesis Power Ltd also considers that it is unclear what the "special qualities" of the freshwater environment are that the policy refers to. **D Riddiford** and **Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc)** support this submission.

Evidence Heard

Wellington Fish and Game Council (496.2) spoke in support of their submission seeking the retention of Policy (c), so as to better support the Environmental Quality objective.

Commissioners' Deliberations

The Commissioners noted the Section 42A Recommendation to alter the policy as submitted by Genesis Power Ltd, and the Commissioners support this recommendation. The Commissioners consider the overall objective is better achieved through the amended policy.

The Commissioners note that the points raised by Wairarapa Inc/Go Wairarapa are addressed in the deliberations of Policy (b).

Amend Policy (c) as follows:

"Ensure that adverse cumulative effects of Discourage subdivision, land use and development where it would contribute to cumulative long term adverse effects on the special qualities of the freshwater environment are avoided, remedied or mitigated."

Reasons

This decision is made for the following reasons:

The duty of the Act is to avoid, remedy or mitigate any adverse effects of activities on the environment. Deletion of the words "special qualities" will not detract from the duty to avoid, remedy or mitigate adverse cumulative effects on the freshwater environment as provided for in Policy (c). The amended policy better achieves the objective.

Discussion

The **Department of Conservation** (525.43) seeks that a new Policy be added to ensure appropriate riparian protection is provided through a specific Policy as it considers that 'encouraging' riparian protection is not adequate on its own. **Wellington Regional Council** support this submission. **D Riddiford, Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc),** and **Horticulture NZ** oppose this submission.

Evidence Heard

The **Department of Conservation** (525.43) accept the Section 42A recommendation relating to riparian protection, subject to increased waterbody setbacks (as submitted by the Councils planning departments). **Wellington Regional Council** presented evidence stating they accepted the Section 42A Report recommending no changes to Policy (f).

Commissioners' Deliberations

The Commissioners concurred with the points made in the Section 42A Recommendation that it is not considered efficient or effective to impose a mandatory requirement in a new policy for the provision of permanent riparian protection for waterbodies on or near a site to avoid, remedy or mitigate the impacts of development or subdivision. Other Rules and Methods in the Plan, in particular, the Rules in Chapter 24 of the Plan set out the provisions and circumstances when a 20m wide Esplanade Reserve or Strip is required upon subdivision of land adjoining a waterbody listed in Appendix 1.9 of the Plan or where it is deemed appropriate that the margin of a waterbody not listed in Appendix 1.9 should be protected for conservation, recreational or other values. As there are comprehensive provisions throughout the Plan for managing riparian margins, having regard to the potential costs and responsibilities associated with a mandatory policy, it is not considered efficient or effective to add a blanket policy requiring permanent riparian protection for waterbodies. The Commissioners noted the support by submitters for the Section 42A Report recommendation.

Reasons

This decision is made for the following reasons:

- The existing policies and methods in the Plan in relation to esplanade reserve and strips associated with subdivision and land use activities near waterbodies would effectively enhance the margins of waterbodies.
- A mandatory policy requiring permanent riparian protection for water bodies is not considered cost effective or warranted given existing provisions for managing riparian margins in the plan.

Discussion

Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc) (524.42) seeks that Policy (j) be amended so that a standard width of 20m for an Esplanade Reserve is not required on those waterbodies

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scheduled as significant in the District Plan, but that the width is determined on a case by case basis.

Evidence Heard

Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc) (524.42) spoke in support of their submission requesting the removal of the reference to 20 metres and instead that the width be determined on a case by case basis. While Federated Farmers accept the certainty the current policy provides, and accepts there are circumstances in which the width can be varied, it submits that as the policy is currently worded, Council is restricted in its ability to reduce the width to recognise these.

Commissioners' Deliberations

While the Commissioners recognised and understood the matters the points raised by the submitter, they support the Section 42A recommendation that the policy be retained unchanged on the grounds of certainty, consistency, access and functioning of the waterbody.

Section 230 of the Act prescribes the provision for a 20m wide Esplanade Reserve for subdivision creating any lot less than 4ha. For lots over 4ha the Plan may specify the width to be vested.

Given the range of functions that an Esplanade Reserve/Strip network serves as set out in Section 229 of the Act, and having regard of the need to establish a coherent interconnected network that accommodates the above functions, and having regard to other factors like variable terrain, adjoining land uses, and access for maintenance requirements, the provision of a 20m wide Esplanade Reserve/Strip is a reasonable and practical width to be provided. As Esplanades Reserves/Strips are provided at the time of subdivision of land, which often occurs on an ad hoc basis, the risk associated with adopting an approach of determining the Esplanade Reserve/Strip width on a case by case basis is that it risks over many years of not obtaining a coherent network.

A further consideration is that where the bank of a waterbody changes course or erodes the 20m width of the Esplanade Reserve boundaries do not move along with the changed edge of the waterbody. Therefore, a 20m wide Esplanade Reserve provides some room to accommodate movement of the bank of the waterbody.

 The provision of a 20m esplanade reserve, esplanade strip or access strip provides certainty, consistency, the provision of access and enable natural the functioning of the waterbody.

Discussion

Wellington Fish and Game Council (496.5) supports Policy (k).

Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc) (524.43) opposes Policy (k) and seeks that it be amended to recognise that many structures are necessary in a farming context, including culverts and bridges. In particular, it notes that these structures are necessary and provide against adverse environmental effects. To prevent the construction of such structures could create a perverse environmental outcome. **Horticulture NZ** (FS52) and **Wellington Regional Council** (FS89) support this submission.

Mighty River Power Ltd (520.3) opposes Policy (k) in part and seeks that it be amended to recognise that the Act is enabling legislation provided the preservation of the natural character of waterbodies is preserved and they are protected from inappropriate subdivision, use and development.

Evidence Heard

Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc) (524.43) spoke in support of the submission and expressed support for the Section 42A recommendation that policy (k) be amended as outlined in the Section 42A Report. Wellington Regional Council (FS89) as a further submitter expressed support for the Section 42A recommendation. Wellington Fish and Game Council (496.5) also expressed support for the Section 42A recommendation that policy (k) be amended as outlined in the Section 42A Report. The submitter was pleased to note that maimais are recognised as an integral part of the Wairarapa wetlands. Mighty River Power Ltd (520.3) presented evidence opposing the Section 42A recommendation and request that the policy be amended to "prevent structures on identified significant waterbodies" and/or "discourage structures on all other waterbodies". The prevention of structures under this policy on all waterbodies, rather than restricting it to identified significant waterbodies, could preclude hydro-electric generation structures across the districts.

Commissioners' Deliberations

The Commissioners accept the rewording of policy (k) as recommended in the Section 42A Report. They concur with the Section 42A Report recommendation that the amendment sought by Federated Farmers encapsulates the type of structures which are an accepted and essential part of the waterbody environment. The reasons for rejecting the submission by

Mighty River Power Ltd, as provided in the Section 42A Report, are also accepted by the Commissioners.

Decision Amendment: 12.3.2 Fwe1 Policies: Policy (k)

Amend Policy (k) as follows:

Prevent structures on waterbodies and their margins unless such structures are small, unobtrusive and they are an accepted or essential part of the waterbody environment (for example, culverts, bridges or stock crossings, maimai's and flood defence systems)."

Reasons

This decision is made for the following reasons:

- The amendment encapsulates the type of structures which are an accepted and essential part of the waterbody environment. Such structures are not necessarily small or unobtrusive yet they are accepted and essential. Structures also have potential to adversely affect the natural character and amenity of any waterbody and its margin and which is relevant not only to significant waterbodies.
- The re-wording of policy (k) provides a balance between maintaining natural and physical features of the waterbody environment and allowing for certain development and associated uses which by their nature are constructed on or adjacent to a waterbody.

Discussion

The **Department of Conservation** (525.40) seeks a new Policy be added to give guidance to Plan users about the cumulative effect of development on waterbodies of all sizes and types and the need to proactively seek riparian protection of all waterbodies. **Wellington Regional Council** support this submission. **D Riddiford, Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc)** and **Mighty River Power Ltd** oppose this submission.

The **Department of Conservation** (525.41) seeks a new Policy be added to address development impacts on ground water levels of waterbodies. Development can disrupt or directly or indirectly (e.g. water use through subdivision of the area) result in changes to water levels in adjacent areas. There should be consideration of the impact of subdivision on water levels of water bodies. **Wellington Regional Council** support this submission. **D Riddiford, Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc)** and **Horticulture NZ** oppose this submission.

The **Department of Conservation** (525.46) seeks a new Policy be added to give effect to the need to protect the natural character of waterbodies by ensuring that pest fish and plants are not introduced to an area through development or subdivision.

Wairarapa Public Health (498.5) seek a new Policy be added to address water supply catchment protection. **Horticulture NZ** oppose this submission.

Wellington Fish and Game Council (496.4) seeks a new Policy be added that gives guidance to Plan users about the cumulative impact of development on waterbodies of all sizes and types, and the need to pro-actively seek riparian protection of all waterbodies. **D Riddiford, Federated Farmers of NZ** (Inc) and **Mighty River Power Ltd** oppose this submission.

Evidence Heard

In respect of submission 525.40, the **Department of Conservation** accept the Section 42A recommendation relating to the protection of riparian margins subject to increased waterbody setbacks (as submitted by the Councils planning departments), and accept and support the Section 42A recommendation relating to their submission points 524.41 and 525.46.

Wellington Regional Council presented evidence stating they do not support the recommendation in relation to submission point 525.40 as they submit it would be appropriate for the plan to adopt a policy promoting the retention of riparian vegetation where freshwater values exist on or near the site, rather than relying on the non-regulatory methods in the Proposed Plan. **Wellington Regional Council** also do not support the recommendation in relation to submission 525.41 as they submit it would be appropriate for the plan to adopt a policy promoting the avoidance or mitigation of the effects of subdivision, use and development of land on water bodies.

Wellington Fish and Game Council (496.4) spoke in support of their submission and commented that the recommendation in policy 12.3.5(d) goes some way towards satisfying their concerns if the word "manage" would include effective riparian management as a tool in minimising the adverse effects on waterways by subdivision, land use and development.

Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc) spoke in support of their submission.

Commissioners' Deliberations

The Commissioners note the support from the Department of Conservation in relation to the officer recommendation in respect of submission points 525.40, 525.41 and 525.46.

As noted in the Section 42A Report, in respect of cumulative effects and riparian management, it is considered that these matters are already effectively covered by Policies 12.3.5(c) to (f), and 12.3.2 Fwe1 Policy (f). The Commissioners concur with the Section 42A comments that the submitted Policy does not recognise that subdivision and development by its nature modifies the physical environment and, as such, has potential off-site impacts. The Act is concerned with avoiding, remedying or mitigating adverse effects. Therefore, for the above reasons it has been decided to not add the requested new Policy.

With respect to the submission relating to development impacts on ground water levels of waterbodies, as noted in the Section 42A Report, the impacts of activities on changes to water levels of water bodies is a Regional Council function and not a District Council function as provided in section 30(1) of the Resource Management Act. With respect to the matters that are within the responsibility of District Councils, the effects of activities on natural values, and in particular on water bodies, are addressed in the District Wide chapters. An amendment has been decided in respect of Policy 12.3.5(d) as this change better reflects the purpose of the policy.

In respect of the submission relating to pest fish and plants, the Commissioners note that it is not a District Council function to control pest plants, and it is not considered to be a function of District Council's to control pest fish and plant species in artificial water bodies. As such no amendments are proposed.

In respect of the submission relating to public water supply, the Commissioners accept the Section 42A recommendation to add reference to water supply catchments to Policy 18.3.2(g) of the Plan as amendment better describes the intention of the policy.

Discussion

The **Department of Conservation** (525.42) seek that the Explanation be amended to recognise that more intensive use of the surface of waterbodies can have impacts, and therefore that controls would be necessary in some situations e.g. over a certain threshold of usage. Surface water body use can also impact on wildlife and that provisions be added to control the intensive usage of the surface of waterbodies (section 21.1.8 of the Plan). This is supported by **Wellington Regional Council** (FS90).

Mighty River Power Ltd (520.3) seek that the first sentence of paragraph 3 of Explanation 12.3.3 be deleted as the appropriateness of structures within waterbodies is dependent on the needs and demands of the community and the degree of their adverse effects. **D Riddiford** and **Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc)** oppose this submission.

Mighty River Power Ltd (520.4) seek that the first sentence of paragraph 5 of Explanation 12.3.3 be amended to be consistent with the phraseology in section 6 of the RMA. The submission also queries whether it is necessary to manage an activity (water runoff) where it has no adverse environmental effects. **D Riddiford** and **Federated Farmers of NZ** support this submission.

Evidence Heard

The **Department of Conservation** (525.42) spoke in support of the submission and expressed acceptance and support for the Section 42A recommendation that the second paragraph of Explanation 12.3.3 be amended, and Rule 21.1.8 be amended to exclude motorised commercial recreation which will be added as a Restricted Discretionary Activity under Rule 21.3., as outlined in the Section 42A Report. The **Wellington Regional Council** (FS90) also expressed support for the Section 42A recommendation in respect of submission point 545.42.

Mighty River Power Ltd spoke in support of the Section 42A Report recommendation in relation to the amendment to paragraph 3 (submission 520.3), as it recognises that hydroelectric generation structures by their nature and function are required to be located in waterbodies.

Commissioners' Deliberations

The Commissioners note the support from original submitters for the amendments to the explanation and concurred with the recommendation in the Section 42A Report relating to the amendment to 12.3.3 Explanation.

Amend the second paragraph of 12.3.3 Explanation as follows:

In regard to the surface of waterbodies, the recreational or other casual use of rivers, lakes and wetlands has generally occurred with minimal conflict and therefore needed no controls. Activities will have to comply with other environmental standards, such as the relevant noise limits for the Zone. However, there is potential that if more intensive use of the surface of waterbodies occurs from motorised commercial recreation. This more intensive use can have impacts and conflict with other users of the waterbodies and with natural values and habitats. Therefore controls are necessary for motorised commercial recreation.

Amend Rule 21.1.8 (District Wide Permitted Activities) as follows:

- 21.1.8 Activities on the Surface of Freshwater
- (a) Any activity, **excluding motorised commercial recreation**, on the surface of any freshwater body (including wetlands, rivers and lakes) which meets the following standard:
 - (i) Structures shall be:
 - (1) Less than 10 square metres in gross floor area; and
 - (2) Located on or above the surface of water for less than two months within a twelve-month period.

Consequential Change: Amend Rule 21.3 (District Wide Restricted Discretionary Activities) by adding a new restricted discretionary activity 21.3.13 as follows:

- 21.3.13 Motorised commercial recreation on the surface of freshwater
- (a) Any motorised commercial recreation on the surface of freshwater.

Discretion is restricted to the following matters:

- (i) The scale, character and nature of the activity, including the frequency and size of watercraft associated with the activity.
- (ii) Potential for conflict between the activity/structure and other users of the same waterbody.
- (iii) Effects of activities on land associated with the proposed activity including the impact on public access.
- (iv) Extent to which the activity will reduce opportunities for recreational activities.
- (v) Effects of the activity on the intrinsic and natural values of the waterbody.

Amend paragraph 3 of 12.3.3 Explanation as follows:

Other than flood defence systems, bridges and small recreational structures, it is generally inappropriate to place structures within waterbodies. However, some activities by their nature and function are required to be located in waterbodies, including structures for irrigation, water supply, or energy generation. In addition, other sStructures and facilities, however, may be required..."

Amend the first sentence of paragraph 5 of 12.3.3 Explanation as follows:

Managing the interface between land and water is an important element to protecting preserving the natural character of rivers, lakes and wetlands, to maintaining and enhancing public access and to manage the adverse environmental effects of water runoff from the land.

Reasons

This decision is made for the following reasons:

- There is potential for more intensive use, in particular, commercial recreation use, of the surface of waterbodies to occur which has potential to create conflict with other users, and with the natural values and habitats of the waterbodies. The amendments recognise these conflicts.
- The amendment in relation to structures identifies that in providing for the sustainable management of the surface of waterbodies to meet the needs of people and communities that there may be occasions where other structures are needed in waterbodies.
- The amendment provides terminology that is consistent with the phraseology in section 6 of the RMA to retain the intent of the explanation and better reflect the purpose of the Act.

Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc) (524.44) seek Objective 12.3.4 be amended to add the words "where a demand exists" as it is inappropriate to facilitate public access to all the

Wairarapa's rivers, lakes and wetlands and their margins. Access should be determined based on demand in which the public have identified a desire to have access.

Mighty River Power Ltd (520.6) seek Objective 12.3.4 be amended to 'preserve' (as opposed to 'protect') the natural character of waterbodies, in order to be consistent with the phraseology used in section 6 of the Act.

Wellington Fish and Game Council (496.6) seek Objective 12.3.4 be amended to better reflect the intent of section 6 of the RMA and incorporate the words "where new public access is to be created" (or similar), as Wellington Fish and Game Council consider that it is only where new public access is being created that the property rights of adjoining land owners need to be protected.

Evidence Heard

Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc) spoke in support of their submission and noted that they considered the Section 42A Report makes the assumption that the wording would maintain the status quo. In their opinion it does not have to be quantified in that manner, and that demand can and will change over the lifespan of the plan and community expectations of access may change over this time. Comments were also made in respect of community desires and expectations in relation to Section 6(d) responsibilities. They seek an insertion to Obejctive 12.3.4. to recognise this change over time.

Wellington Fish and Game Council (496.6) spoke in support of their submission reiterating their request for word insertion so as to ensure the public are able to enjoy their legal right to public access.

Commissioners' Deliberations

The Commissioners concur with the Section 42A Report comment and recommendations in relation to Objective 12.3.4, in particular, the terminology should be consistent with the Act.

Planning for public access to water bodies – a 'blue-green network' - is about providing for the recreation needs of current and future generations. The Policies and Methods to achieve Objective 12.3.4 do not seek to obtain new public access to all waterbodies but to prioritise the needs for public access to those identified waterbodies with significant value.

The Commissioners believe the current wording provides an appropriate balance between the activity of public access as well as to the activities of the adjoining land owners.

The **Department of Conservation** (525.115) and **Wellington Fish and Game Council** (496.10) seeks that the additional waterbodies be added to Appendix 1.9 Significant Water Bodies. **D Riddiford, Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc),** and **Adamson Land Surveyors** oppose this submission. **S Barton** supports the submission of the Wellington Fish and Game Council.

D Daniell (499.3) seeks clarification of what the classification of significant waterbodies means for landowners, and that provision for building in the flood zone area be explored.

The Planning Departments of Masterton, Carterton and South Wairarapa District Councils (522.72) seeks that corrections are made to listings for the South Wairarapa District in Appendix 1.9. Windy Peak Trust oppose this submission.

Mighty River Power Ltd (520.48) seeks that for each significant waterbody in Appendix 1.9 that it is clearly identified what the relevant conservation, recreation or other values are that makes it a significant water body. **D Riddiford and Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc)** support this submission. **Horticulture NZ** oppose this submission.

Wairarapa Federated Farmers (308.2) opposes the significant waterbodies listed for South Wairarapa District, and seeks that only those waterbodies be listed where consultation can be shown to have taken place and agreement with land owners has been reached. It is also submitted that additional significant waterbodies should wait until the Significant Natural Area variation is done to see what the public think, not what lobby groups press for. **D Riddiford** and **Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc)** support this submission.

Evidence Heard

Wellington Fish and Game Council (496.10) spoke in support of their submission but question the need to limit the schedule only to waters of national importance.

Federated Farmers of NZ (Inc) (524.47) spoke in support of their submissions and presented evidence outlining their concern with the approach taken to identify the significant waterbodies listed in Appendix 1.9. Federated Farmers Inc seek detailed information regarding the criterion used to determine waterbodies in Appendix 1.9, and conduct a comprehensive assessment in the South Wairarapa.

D Riddiford spoke in support of his submission to remove references to SNAs at the mouth of the Oreirei River.

D Daniell spoke in support of his submission

Adamson Land Surveyors noted that they opposed the inclusion of the water bodies listed in the Plan so far as esplanade strips and reserves are considered. They noted they did not oppose that they be listed as significant water bodies. The expressed their support and acceptance for the recommendation to include Lake Onoke.

The **Department of Conservation** (525.115) spoke in support of their submission requesting the Section 42A Report recommendation be set aside and that the plan add the waterbodies as identified in their submission, to Appendix 1.9 and these be shown on the planning maps. DOC also request that the Plan add a more comprehensive and detailed description of "Lake Wairarapa" wetlands in Reference No Ws01, and show the extended area on Planning Map 24.

Commissioners' Deliberations

For the reasons outlined in the Section 42A Report , it is agreed that Lake Onoke also be added to the significant waterbodies listed in Appendix 1.9 of the Plan. Identifying the lake in this manner would form a continuous significant waterbody between the coast and the upstream significant waterbodies. In respect of other waterbodies requested for inclusion, the Commissioners have determined that these not be included at this time. As noted in the Section 42A Report, when the national Water Programme of Action has been completed and the list of waterbodies finalised, Council's may at that time wish to review whether any further waterbodies are added to Appendix 1.9.

In respect of the submission by Mr Daniells, the Commissioners note the comments provided in the Section 42A Report outlining what the classification of significant waterbodies means for landowners.

The Commissioners support the corrective amendments after carefully consideration of the matters raised by submitters.
